## Exchange of Expertise: A UICC Fellow Enhances his Skills in the Smoking Cessation Clinics at King Hussein Cancer Center

## **About the Visit**

The King Hussein Cancer Center (KHCC) hosted a visiting physician through the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC) technical fellowship grant. The physician participated in a structured two-week program in January 2024 aimed at advancing knowledge and skills in tobacco dependence treatment (TDT) by providing hands-on experience within KHCC's ongoing TDT services.

## **Meet our Visiting TTS**

Dr. Ayman Al-Dahshan is a well-experienced community medicine practitioner committed to establishing sustainable lifestyle health programs. He is a graduate of Misr University for Science and Technology and holds certifications from the Arab Board of Health Specializations. Dr. Al-Dahshan obtained his certification as a Tobacco Treatment Specialist (TTS) from KHCC's TDT training program in 2021 and subsequently completed a 16-month field training program during which he contributed to wellness clinics, smoking cessation programs, and community health initiatives. Currently, Dr. Al-Dahshan works at Hamad Medical Corporation and is certified in Lifestyle Medicine and Clinical Informatics. He was awarded the technical fellowship grant by the Union for International Cancer Control to visit KHCC's TDT clinics in January 2024.

## The Experience

The visit spanned two weeks and combined both theoretical learning and practical tasks. The applied activities included conducting an initial assessment, using behavior change techniques to counsel patients, suggesting appropriate medication regimens based on pharmacological knowledge, assessing individual cases, developing customized treatment plans, and understanding the key components of a patient tracking database.

During his visit, Dr. Al-Dahshan attended multiple clinics and was able to counsel a unique patient population, specifically cancer patients. In addition, the visiting TTS was tasked with assignments related to critically reviewing interventions for smoking cessation, and delivering presentations on these topics. The visit culminated in a comprehensive discussion of the assignments, allowing Dr. Al-Dahshan to reflect on his experiences and contributions.

In addition to the core activities within KHCC's TDT services, the visit featured a journal club discussion that aimed to promote collaborative learning. The discussion revolved around topics related to tobacco dependence treatment in cancer care. Dr. Al-Dahshan had the opportunity to share insights with medical residents, emphasizing the significance of TDT within clinical settings from the perspective of a TTS.
